Dear Seniors,

Happy Older Americans Month! When Older Americans Month was established in 1963. only 17 million living Americans had reached their 65th birthday. About a third of older Americans lived in poverty and there were few programs to meet their needs. Interest in older Americans and their concerns was growing. A meeting in April 1963 between President John F. Kennedy and members of the National Council of Senior Citizens led to designating May as "Senior Citizens Month," the prelude to "Older Americans Month."

Historically, Older Americans Month has been a time to acknowledge the contributions of past and current older persons to our country, in particular those who defended our country. Every President since Kennedy has issued a formal proclamation during or before the month of May asking that the entire nation pay tribute in some way to older persons in their

the nation's observance of Older Americans Month (OAM), a time to recognize older Americans' contributions, highlight aging trends, and reaffirm our commitment to serving older adults.

The 2025 theme, Flip the Script on Aging, focuses on transforming how society perceives, talks about, and approaches aging. It encourages individuals and communities to challenge stereotypes and dispel misconceptions. This year, please join Guernsey County Senior Citizens Center in honoring older adults' contributions, exploring the many opportunities for staying active and engaged as we age, and highlighting the opportunities for purpose, exploration, and connection that come with aging.

We've planned a whole month filled with special activities and events in celebration of Older Americans Month. Together, we will officially kick-off Older Americans Month-May 2025 by hosting a buffet breakfast on Friday, May 2nd, followed by the spectacular Older Adult Extravaganza at Pritchard Laughlin Civic Center on Thursday, May 8th, the Annual Senior Day Luncheon on Wednesday, May 14th, and conclude our month-long celebrations at the Senior Picnic at Cambridge City Park on Wednesday, May 28th. I hope to see you at these upcoming events.

In conjunction with celebrating Older Americans Month in May, it is important to note that the Administration for Community Living (ACL) is in serious jeopardy at the federal level and as of the writing of this newsletter has been targeted to close by the POTUS and Health and Human Services Director Robert F. Kennedy, Jr.. ACL was created around the fundamental principle that all people, regardless of age or disability, should be able to live independently and fully participate in their communities. By advocating across the federal government for older adults, people with disabilities, and families and caregivers; funding services and supports provided by primarily by networks of community-based organizations; and investing in training, education, research and innovation, ACL helps principle a reality for millions of Americans. ACL was initially established in April 2012, bringing together federal advocacy for older adults and people with disabilities, along with most federal human services programs for older adults and people with intellectual and developmental disabilities, missions previously housed in multiple organizations across the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. Our portfolio has grown significantly in the years since with the transfer of programs from other agencies to ACL. These additions include a research institute; independent living, assistive technology, and traumatic brain injury programs; paralysis and limb-loss resource centers; and programs that help people navigate their Medicare benefits and the health system.

Today, ACL's budget awards several thousand grants and contracts to help people of all ages live independently in their communities. This work has never been more important. There are more than 77 million people age 60 and older, and more than 61 million people with disabilities living in the United States. All but a tiny percentage of them live in non-institutional settings. Both populations are growing, and older Americans are one of the fastest-growing demographics in the country; by 2040, there will be more than 80 million people over the age of 65.

Bringing together aging and disability work has worked remarkably well. Stakeholders embraced the concept and committed to making it successful. Ten years later, these communities are increasingly coming together at the state and local levels, and ACL is frequently asked for help in forging these new collaborative relationships.

There are a lot of similarities in the services and supports older adults and people with disabilities need in order to live independently. As one agency, ACL is able to leverage learnings and best practices for meeting those similar needs. Further, the disability and aging communities together have a larger voice, and ultimately are more successful advocates, than either community on its own. At the same

time, ACL recognizes that some people with disabilities and some older adults experience challenges in understanding and communicating their preferences and needs, and family members and caregivers often play a critical role in ensuring that those preferences are honored and needs are met. ACL also recognizes that the preferences of the individual are not the only factor in determining how to best support that person. The availability of services and supports in a variety of settings, the resources and availability of family caregivers, and other factors also must be considered. ACL also focuses on protecting rights and preventing abuse. All people have the right to live their lives with dignity and respect, free from abuse of any kind. Unfortunately, far too many older adults and people with disabilities are abused, neglected or exploited. ACL is committed to developing systems programs that prevent abuse from happening, protecting people from abusive situations, and supporting people who have experienced abuse to help them recover.

Guernsey County Senior Citizens Center's mission is foundationally based upon seniors' freedom to make their own choices and supports the philosophy of people living independently and where they want to live. ACL believes that home- and community-based services and supports should be robust enough that individuals with even the most complex medical and behavioral needs can be appropriately and effectively supported in their own home or other community-based settings. We know this is possible – it has been demonstrated in many communities, including right here in Guernsey County.

Therefore, ACL advocates for the continued expansion and coordination of home- and community-based services and improvements in quality so that older adults and people with disabilities have more and better options about how and where to receive the long-term services and supports they need....sadly, at the time of writing this editorial, over 10,000 Federal Health & Human Services and ACL employee's jobs have been terminated and the

fate of ACL, and critical Older Americans Act funds are in serious jeopardy. Older Americans Act Funding, which supports Title III programs such as transportation, homemaking, meals on wheels, congregate meals, legal assistance, and other home and community based senior services and programs provided by Guernsey County Senior Citizens Center and other providers across the nation are at risk. In pre-celebration of Older Americans senior Month in May, citizens encouraged to ACT NOW by emailing, telephoning, or writing to your United States Senators, Ohio Senators Moreno and Husted, Senate Health Committee Chairman Bill Cassidy (R-LA), and Ranking Member Senator Bernie Sanders (D-VT) and **VOICE YOUR CONCERNS**. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) has moved forward with its announced restructuring, including a significant workforce reduction. These layoffs have effectively shuttered the Administration for Community Living (ACL) regional offices and led to the dismissal of at least 40% of ACL staff overall. Why does this matter? The reduction in HHS & ACL staff posses significant risks to program vital to the well-being of vulnerable populations. Senior Centers across Ohio have serious concern about how these changes will disrupt program oversight, funding distribution and service delivery for older adults and individuals with disabilities who rely on these essential services.

Please know, we are deeply committed to assisting and serving Guernsey County senior citizens and we appreciate your loyalty, dedication, and support. We look forward to you joining us in celebrating Older Americans Month as together we "Flip the Script on Aging". Have a "Happy Mother's Day" and may God continue to bless us all as we celebrate Memorial Day.





Utility Assistance Available For Senior Citizens

Heating Assistance Available Application Deadline: May 31, 2025

The Ohio Department of Development and the Area Agency on Aging, Region 9 want to remind older Ohioans that assistance is available to help with their home energy bills. The Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) helps Ohioans at or below 175% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines for a household of up to seven members and 60% of State Median Income for a household of eight or more members to pay their heating bills.

Applied directly to the customer's utility or bulk fuel bill, the benefit can help manage heating costs. Older Ohioans may go to their local Area Agency on Aging office for help with assembling the required documents and completing their HEAP application. They may also visit www.energyhelp.ohio.gov to apply online or to download a copy of the application.

When applying, individuals need to have copies of the following documents:

- Most recent utility bills.
- A list of all household members (including birth dates and Social Security numbers).
- Proof of income for the past 30 days for all household members (12 months for certain income types).
- Proof of U.S. citizenship or legal residency for all household members.
- Proof of disability (if applicable).

HEAP benefits are applied to an individual's energy bill after Jan. 1. Applications for the HEAP program must be received by May 31, 2025.

Energy Assistance Available to Reconnect/ Avoid Disconnection of Utilities

Ohio's electric and natural gas customers have the opportunity to use the Winter Reconnect Order (WRO) during the winter heating season from October 18th through April 15th to reconnect or to avoid disconnection of their utilities. The WRO applies only to Ohio's investor-owned electric and natural gas utilities and does not apply to municipally owned utilities or rural electric co-ops. To apply, contact your utility company.

The order allows any electric or natural gas customer of an investor-owned utility to avoid disconnection or to reconnect their service for \$175, even if the customer owes more and cannot afford to pay the entire balance.

It is always recommended to speak with a representative of the utility company or your local community action agency before using the WRO.

Contact your local community action agency, located at 185 S 2nd St, Byesville, by calling (740) 685-2422 or (740) 685-2423 for additional information. If you would like someone to assist you in talking to your utility company, you can call the

Public Utilities Commission (PUCO) by calling 1-800-686-7826.

Dollar Energy Fund & Neighbor To
Neighbor Program Assistance

Dollar Energy Fund and AEP Ohio have teamed up to create a program that will assist low-income AEP Ohio customers who have difficulty paying their electric bill. The program will provide eligible customers with a utility assistance grant applied directly to the AEP Ohio bill. This grant will help low-income customers maintain or restore their basic electric service.

Eligible Households

- 1. Must be a customer of AEP
- 2. Be at or below 250% of the Poverty Income Guidelines (FPIGs), a family of four earning up to \$65, 500 per year is eligible.
- 3. Have made a sincere effort of payment on their AEP bill. A sincere effort is a minimum of \$75 in the last 90 days. Exceptions for senior citizens will apply.
- 4. Have a minimum balance of \$100 on their AEP bill.

Services provided by the Guernsey County Senior Citizens Center Inc.

Transportation Services- Our courteous and professional van drivers personally escort senior citizens to medical exams and appointments; shopping and personal business trips; to pick-up prescription medications at pharmacies; to senior nutrition sites; and a host of other senior wellness related facilities. 24-hour advance reservations are required. **Homemaking-** Home health care providers can visit your home and provide routine homemaking services such as cleaning, laundry, essential shopping, and meal preparation. Home health care workers also provide in-home help with Personal Care to promote and maintain essential personal hygiene, which also encourages improved self-image and good self-esteem.

Home Delivered "Meals on Wheels"- Hot, home style, nutritious, well-balanced home delivered meals are available Monday-Friday. Frozen meals are available for weekends and holidays. Emergency meals (to have on hand during periods of inclement weather) are also provided in each home during the winter months.

Morning Breakfast Program-GCSCC serves a nutritious breakfast each weekday at the Senior Center and delivers nutritious breakfasts each day to nutritionally at-risk older adults (Partially funded by United Way of Guernsey County).

Congregate Meals- Hot, nutritious meals are provided in a group social setting Monday-Friday at the Guernsey County Senior Citizens Center and our many Senior Nutrition Sites, which include; Cambridge Heights Apartments, Stop Nine Senior Center-Byesville, Londonderry, Cumberland, and Pleasant City. Meals are also served every Thursday at "Golden Sixties" located at the Stop Nine Church of Christ, Byesville, Ohio. *Reservations are encouraged and recommended*.

Legal Assistance- Legal work of a non-criminal nature (up to \$250.00) is available for seniors age 60 and over. Legal services subjects such as wills, power of attorney, real estate, probate, etc.... are provided by local attorneys.

PASSPORT- The Guernsey County Senior Citizens Center is a certified "PASSPORT Qualified Facility" in close cooperation with the Ohio Department of Aging and Area Agency on Aging-Region 9 (740) 439-4478.

Telephone Reassurance- To insure the continued well-being of elderly individuals who are isolated or homebound, our professional staff and volunteers provide regular telephone contact to monitor their safety and well-being.

Medical Assessments- Qualified medical personnel provide blood pressure and pulse screenings each week. Cholesterol and blood sugar examinations, vision assessments, hearing screenings, and other wellness related screenings are also available throughout the year.

Educational Programs- Regular scheduled presentations and classes are conducted on subjects of interest to inform, enlighten, and inspire older adults and to stimulate mental activity.

Information & Referral- Individuals are given names, telephone numbers, and addresses of private and public organizations that can assist them with meeting their needs.

Social Activities & Special Events- Social and recreational activities occur daily here at the senior center. Activities include; Quilting, Crafting, Exercise, Tai Chi, Line Dancing, Painting, Computer Classes, Euchre, Bridge, Monthly Theme Dinners, Square Dancing, Aerobics, Music, Entertainment, and much more!

Volunteer Respite Program- This program is operated by our trained volunteers who can assist in providing caregivers with a much needed and temporary break from their caregiving responsibilities, providing them with rejuvenated respite. If you are caring for an older adult at least 60 years of age and need a much-needed break or are interested in serving as a Volunteer Respite, please contact us today.

Senior Supplemental Food Commodities Program – Monthly Food Program that provides 30-35 pounds of groceries each month (cheese every other month) to almost 360 seniors who are at least age 60 and meet income Federal Poverty Guideline eligibility criteria.
